C. CHAIRMAN UPDATE & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR UPDATE

II. GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

A. FINANCIALS

Armstrong Backus oversees the financials of the APC. The CouncilTreasure Deborah WALDEN RALLS presented the latest financial report.

B. FAIR ACT STUDY

BACKGROUND: Every five years, a Federal Marketing Order must conduct a study that demonstrates the benefits of the Order. This is a requirement under the Federal Activities Inventory Reform (FAIR) Act. In order to conduct the study, the American Pecan Council must hire a reputable firm or University to conduct the study.

In order to meet this requirement, the APC through a Request for Proposal, hired Texas A&M to conduct the mandatory FAIR ACT study. Results of the study were outlined in the Executive Summary. The Executive Summary states:

The primary conclusion from the promotion analysis is that, despite its relatively recent launch, the American Pecan Council has effectively enhanced domestic and export demand for U.S. pecans over 2016/17 through 2019/20 through its generic promotion activities and generated a relatively high rate of return to pecan producers who have paid for the promotion over that period. The principal accomplishment of the APC domestic and export promotion program has been to support the annual average producer price of pecans about 24¢/lb (11%) above the level to which it might have fallen over the period of 2016/17 through 2019/20 if the promotion had not been done. Given APC promotion expenditures (including MAP funds but excluding administrative costs), the benefit-cost ratio for the APC promotion program for 2016/17 through 2019/20 is calculated at 9.9, meaning that the promotion returned \$9.9 in profit to pecan producers for every dollar spent on promotion.

A complete copy of the report is located on the APC's website. Also, all pecan associations, councilmembers, and trade and press publications were given copies of the report. Please take the time to share the conclusions with your constituencies as the report shows the effectiveness of the Federal Marketing Order.

IV. INDUSTRY RELATIONS COMMITTEE

A. ELECTRONIC REPORTING

Updates of the electronic reporting platform is listed below.

APC has been working with Fishhook to develop the electronic reporting portal.
 After feedbackfrom the Electronic Reporting Working Group, we were able to make adjustments and addition to the portal prior to the 2020 crop year.

- Webinar APC hosted an introductory webinar on Monday, August 31, to familiarize handlers with the Pecan Portal and the updated 2020 crop year reporting forms prior to itsofficial launch at the beginning of September. The recorded webinar has been published in the Handler Portal of the American Pecan website. Also, a portal quick start guide was included in the 2020-2021 handler packets to serve as a brief user manual to the platform. APC is looking at conducting more webinars in the upcoming months to go over additional features and tools added and welcome any feedback.
- Official Launch The platform was successfully launched at the beginning of the crop year. Handlers have been able to submit their forms for the 2020 crop year in the portal. We havereceived very positive feedback on how much the portal has really helped streamline the reporting process and cut down reporting time.
- Handler Analytics APC and Fishhook have completed a bulk import of all
 historical data which is necessary for the build out of the handler analytics
 tool. It is currently hosted in thebackend of the portal to ensure the report
 and graph functions are working properly. Once final testing is complete, we
 will notify industry of the official launch.

B. INDUSTRY AUDIT

Updates of the handler audits for the 2017 and 2018 crop year audits.

- APC has contracted with Moss Adams to conduct randomly selected third party audits on 25% of all handlers for each crop year to ensure the accuracy of the data submitted to the Council office. Moss Adams completed the 2017 and 2018 crop year audits.
- Data Amendments APC staff works with each handler to address any findings during the auditregarding their reporting. On top of that, APC has also identified handlers who have not been reporting or paying an assessment, and have helped bring them into compliance with the Federal Marketing Order. Both items described have factored into the amendments of reports.
- Moss Adams will be making handler selections for the 2019 crop year handler audits, APC staffis currently working on gathering the necessary information and documents received for MossAdams review.

VI. GRADES, STANDARDS & RESEARCH COMMITTEE

A. K-COE - QUALITY ASSURANCE PROGRAM

- Quality Assurance Program —APC is currently in development of a voluntary Quality
 AssuranceProgram for the industry. APC contracted with K-Coe Isom to develop the
 program. Phase 1 of the program has been complete where we conducted a
 materiality assessment to identify the needs specific to the U.S. pecan industry as
 well as stakeholders, retail/buyers, and consumers.
- We are currently in Phase 2 of the project. The Quality Assurance Program has been
 drafted. We continue to meet with the QAP working group and other industry
 members to make program adjustments. Based on additional feedback received, we
 are looking at creating a separate certification program for native crop due to the
 differences in practices. APC met with native growers to discuss. We will be
 developing a native working group to begin exploring the possibility of developing a
 native certification program.
- The APC is also exploring industry opportunities related to the anticipated development of carbon markets. APC continues to have conversations with experts and industry members abouthow to best position the industry to take advantage of opportunities presented.

B. INSHELL & KERNEL STANDARDS

Inshell & Shelled Meats Standards – APC recently approved revised standards for both Inshell and Shelled Meats. APC staff submitted as a package to USDA. There are currently two items for the inshell standards that require further clarification. APC staff is awaiting feed back from working group members

Regarding these matters. Once further clarification is received, USDA will move forward with finalizing the standards.
