USDA Seeks Nominees for Council Seats

Fort Worth, TX – The American Pecan Council, the federal marketing order working to increase the demand and value of U.S. pecans, is pleased to invite nominations for new members to serve a four-year term of office beginning on October 1, 2024. Seats are currently open for five growers, three shellers, one accumulator and one public member, as well as their respective alternate seats.

"Whether its supporting exports or building demand for pecans here at home, a diverse set of Council members ensures we keep the APC's work centered on what's best for the entire industry's success."

Nominations will be accepted through April 1, 2024. Ballots with nominees will then be mailed to eligible voters May 1, 2024, and must be received by June 15, 2024.

"Serving on the Council has been an incredible opportunity to connect with industry members across the country and stand up for the industry I love," said Larry Don Womack, Chairman of the American Pecan Council. To be eligible to serve, a grower or producer is one who produce a minimum of 50,000 pounds of inshell pecans during a representative period (2020-2023) or who own a minimum of 30 pecan acres. Sheller refers to any person who converts inshell pecans to shelled pecans and sells the output in any and all markets in the stream of commerce, both within and outside of the production area; Provided, That the term "sheller" shall only include those who shell more than 1 million pounds of inshell pecans in a fiscal year. Accumulator means a person who compiles inshell pecans from other persons for the purpose of resale or transfer. The public member and alternate public member may not have any financial interest, individually or corporately, or affiliation with persons vested in the pecan industry.
